

#### K-State Animal Sciences Leadership Academy

High school students gathered on the Kansas State University campus June 11-14 to gain livestock industry knowledge and develop leadership skills at the 16th annual K-State Animal Science Leadership Academy (KASLA) in Manhattan, KS.

During their time at KASLA, students participated in interactive leadership development and educational lab sessions led by faculty members from across the K-State campus. Participants completed the college experience by staying in the dorms, touring the animal science facilities, and engaging in several livestock industry tours. For their final project, the students were divided into groups during the week to focus on current issues affecting the livestock industry. ASI faculty mentors assisted each group in developing a presentation given as part of the closing reception.

Hosted by the K-State Department of Animal Sciences and Industry and sponsored by the Livestock and Meat Industry Council Inc., the academy's goal is to develop young leaders within the livestock industry and prepare them for a future in this field.

Plans are being made for the 2026 program! KASLA will tentatively be hosted in June, with applications being due in the spring. This program is open to students in grades 9-12. Please watch the KASLA webpage or Facebook page for additional details.





#### Dr. Bob Hines Kansas Swine Classic

The 2025 Dr. Bob Hines Kansas Swine Classic celebrated 40 years with this year's show, hosted at the Riley County Fairgrounds in CiCo Park. There were 106 youth exhibitors from 33 counties who showed 278 swine projects. Youth exhibited pigs in the prospect show, market show, and showmanship. There were also 87 kids who showcased their knowledge in the swine skillathon and 20 photos entered in the "People's Choice" photography contest. 
### Kansas State Fair & Kansas Junior Livestock Show

#### Important Announcements — Nominations → YQCA

State livestock nominations transitioned to an online process in 2022. Families will need to plan ahead and prepare prior to the deadline to get everything completed on time. This includes ordering DNA envelopes in advance. Please watch your email, the website, and the Facebook page for updates as we approach spring. Spread the word to any new families who will be nominating for the first time this year! Anyone who ordered extra DNA envelopes through the online system since 2022 will be able to use them in 2026.

YQCA will continue to be required for all Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and KJLS exhibitors. Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national, multi-specie, youth livestock quality assurance program. Youth may complete the training online or through an instructor-led course with an approved instructor. Exhibitors will submit a copy of their certificate at the time of nomination, or when they order DNA envelopes, so make sure to download it to a device when kids complete the course. It is an annual training. Certificates must be valid through October 1, 2026 to be accepted.



#### Upcoming Events - K-State Junior Producer Days

We are excited to announce the dates for the 2026 K-State Junior Producer Days! The Junior Beef Producer Day will be Saturday, March 7. Tentative topics range from selection to health, and showmanship. The deadline to register is February 13. The cost is \$20/person by the deadline, or \$30 after. Only those registered by February 13 will receive a t-shirt. Junior Sheep Producer Day will be hosted Saturday, April 11. Tentative topics include selection to nutrition, and showmanship. Registration will be due March 20. The cost is \$20/person and t-shirts are only guaranteed for those who sign up by the deadline. Late registrations will be \$30/person.

All youth, parents, leaders, extension agents, and ag teachers are invited to participate in these one-day, family educational experiences. K-State faculty members, graduate students, veterinarians, extension agents, guest speakers and former exhibitors will provide the sessions. There will also be an optional instructor-led YQCA training at the conclusion of the program for both events.

A new registration system will be used this year for the junior day events. Watch the website and Facebook page for details!
