Show Divisions

Judging of Breeding Ewes:

*Ewes will show by breeds: Dorset, Suffolk, Hampshire, Natural, AOB, and Crossbred.

*Registration papers are required (on all ewes born before January 1, 2014) to show as purebred. Exhibitors will be asked to present proof of registration/pending registration on ewes born after January 1, 2014. Registration must be in the sole name of the exhibitor. *If less than 3 head per breed, they will be shown as AOB.

*Classes will break on the following:

January 1- December 31, 2013

January 1, 2013 and later

Judging of Prospect Lambs

- *Lambs will show by breeds: Dorset, Suffolk, Hampshire, AOB, Natural, and Crossbred.
- * If less than 3 head per breed they will show as AOB.
- *Ewes & wethers may be shown in either breeding or market but not both.
- *Bracing: All four feet must be on the ground when lambs are being handled by the judge.

<u>Judging of Meat Goats:</u>

- *Prospect goats may be does or wethers.
- *Teeth: All goats must have baby teeth in place with no visible signs of permanent teeth.
- *Horns: Goats if horned, must be tipped & rounded.
- *Shearing: Equal amount of hair above the knee and hock. (excluding head and belly)
- *Bracing: All four feet must be on the ground when goats are being handled by the judge.

<u>Judging of Breeding Meat Goats:</u>

- *Does may be shown in either market or breeding, but not both.
- *All goats must have an identification number, whether it be an ear tag or a tattoo. Breeding goats will be shown in the proper age bracket based off of age the date of show.
- *Classes will break on the following:

Junior Does- under 12 months

Yearling Does- 12 months to under 24 months

Showmanship Contest:

- *Free to all exhibitors who enter an animal in conformation classses.
- *Classes are broken by exhibitor's age as of January 1, 2014.
- *Senior, Intermediate and Junior classes will be offered.

General Rules

- 1. This show is open to any bonafide 4-H or FFA member who are not yet 19 as of January 1, 2014.
- 2. All animals must be owned and entered under the name of the exhibitor. Exhibitors must show their own animals unless they have more than one animal per class. No limit to number of entries.
- 3. No pay. No weigh. No refunds.
- 4. All entries are accepted with the understanding that the Kansas State University Livestock Judging Team is not responsible for any loss or damage that may arise.
- 5. All straw, wood shavings and bedding materials MUST be cleaned from the area. If not cleaned, prizes will be forfeited.
- 6. Due to very limited pen space, showing out of the trailer is strongly encouraged. Fitting area must be cleaned prior to leaving campus.
- 7. Each exhibitor must provide own bedding and supplies.
- 8. \$20 per head to show in Ring A with an additional \$10 per head for Ring B. After June 1, entry fee is \$30 per head for Ring A and \$20 per head for Ring B.
- 9. Persons showing unnecessary rough handling will be asked to leave the show and forfeit any entry money and prizes. All four feet of the lamb must be on the ground when being handled by the judge.
- 10. No entries will be accepted after the completion of weighing.
- 11. The show committee reserves the right to decide on any questions that are not listed in the rules.
- 12. The decision of the judge is final. Protests for any reason must be submitted in writing and accompanied by a \$100 fee.
- 13. All animals will be judged as show prospect (not finished) animals.
- 14. Anyone with an outstanding insufficient funds check will not be allowed to show until the debt has been paid.
- 15. All out of state animals must have appropriate State of Kansas Health forms. All sheep and goats will be required to have a scrapie tag or association tattoo.
- 16. Any rules or announcements at show will supercede these rules.
- 17. 4-H/FFA members are subject to the code of conduct agreements of their respective organizations. Smoking and alcohol are prohibited on the campus.
- 18. All animals are subject to be inspected at the discretion of the committee for existing signs of club lamb fungus, soremouth, ringworm, and general health before entering the scale area. Any animal determined to be infectious will not be allowed to enter. Show committee shall have the authority to disqualify other animals that have been in contact with an infected animal.
