- These tags are required in ALL swine, sheep and meat goats that are nominated for the Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) &/or the Kansas State Fair. Extension Units may opt to use them locally as well. Animals can only have one 840 EID tag. Check prior to tagging. If animal has existing 840 EID tag, contact Lexie for alternative tagging options in this unique circumstance. Further information regarding tags is available on the KSU Youth Livestock Program website under the EID Tags tab.
 - *Kansas 4-H EID tags greater than 5 years old (2021) are NOT eligible in state nominated animals.
- Orders not received by the deadline will be considered a Special Order, must be received at least 12 weeks prior to needed date, and may be subject to additional shipping charges. There is no guarantee tag orders received after the deadline can be filled.
- Allflex has transitioned to a new lightweight EID for small ruminants. This includes our sheep & meat goat tags. The old ribbon and round tags will continue to be accepted until that numbering series expires.
- There are 20 tags/bag and the minimum order is one (1) bag.
